

Sermon Discussion Questions Autism, OCD, ADHD, & God John 9:1-3

- 1. What does it mean for someone to be made in the image of God? Read Genesis 1:24-31. List the ways humans are unique from the rest of creation.
- 2. Consider the ways Jesus is the "image of God" and what that means for us to be created in the image of God (2 Corinthians 4:3-5; Colossians 1:15-17; Hebrews 1:3).
- 3. Does what someone is able to do make them more or less human? Is a baby less human than an adult? Is a person with severe disability less human? Is a senior with declining cognitive skills less human? If being human isn't defined by ability, then how do we define it?
- 4. If you are someone with diagnosed neurodiversity, do you feel God made a mistake? Have you felt unclean? Have you blamed yourself? Read John 9:3. How might the works of God be displayed in you?
- 5. When a child or adult acts in a way that is within their mental capabilities, but is different than "the norm", how have you reacted? Mock? Slander? Blame? Accept? etc.
- 6. If you are a neurodiverse person, what is it like living in a world where you are different from everyone around you?
- 7. In John 9:1, Jesus "saw" the blind man? Why is it easy to pass by people of disability/difference? How can we "see" people as Jesus saw them?
- 8. Why did the religious leaders ask, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents?" Why do we assume difference is a result of wrongdoing?
- Read James 3:9-10. How are people who are autistic/OCD/ADHD demeaned in our culture? Discuss - Cursing another human is cursing the God who made them.
- 10. When you see a child that seems out of control, what comes to your mind when you look over at the parents? Are you quick to fix their parenting? Do you feel compassion?
- 11. What are practical ways our church could "see" people of difference? What accommodations should our church make for individuals and families?
