Sermon Discussion

Migration as Mission
Ruth 1:1-6

1. Have each person share how many times they have moved in their life. How has moving (or not moving) shaped you as a person?
2. It goes without saying that Bozeman is growing, and that growth is coming from people moving here from outside of MT. How have you viewed this influx of people (do you get excited about new growth and new opportunities, or do you see this as more of a nuisance)? Do you think your answer is in any way related to your own experience?
3. In Ruth 1:1-5, we see Naomi's family migrating to Moab to escape a famine in Bethlehem. What would you have done? How can we see God's hand at work even when we're in a situation not of our choosing?
4. God has a history of moving people. Consider the fact that he chose to use a nomadic people in calling Abraham to leave his home and his family. Read Acts 17:26-27. Why does God move people? How should this shape our view of people on the move?
5. Let's get real. The issue of immigration and illegal immigration is hard for Christians. There are many ways that it can have an impact (both positively and negatively) on a local community. How can we develop a Biblical approach / view of migration that influences the way we interact with this topic in the larger world? Are there other passages or stories in Scripture that come to mind that speak to how we are to do this? Go through the OT passages that protected the migrant (Ex 22:21-22; Exodus 23:9; Lev 19:33-34; Isaiah 58:6-7; Psalm 146:9). How do these passages help us think through the question?
6. Bozeman has suddenly become a destination for many Latino migrants. What are ways our church can enter the mess of migration for the sake of gospel ministry? What are ways you might personally engage this issue?
