Remember Your "First Love"
Revelation 2:1-7

1. In verses 2, 3, and 6, the Ephesians are commended by Christ. What specifically are they commended for? In what ways might the modern Church be commended today?
2. In verse 4, the Ephesian Church is condemned for having abandoned the love they had at the first. What is the love they had at the first? A helpful consideration might be to connect what Jesus would take away from them if they do not repent. Think about how a lampstand shines light. How is that light possibly connected to their love at the first?
3. Is it possible to put a love for doctrinal purity above a love for Christ and each other? How do we love the truth and still love those who see things differently?
4. How might a focus on truth apart from love for others lead to a lack of evangelism (or witness) to the world around us?
5. In verse 7, what is the promise to those who overcome? What is necessary for the Ephesians to overcome? What is the significance of what is offered to the conquerors?
6. We live in a culture that is coming unmoored from a general assumption of Christian thought and ethics. How do we encourage one another to hold to Truth, but also love one another both in the Church and in the World?
