Sermon Discussion

On the Streets of Philadelphia Revelation 3:7-13

With each church, Jesus presents himself as sovereign over the church. This is seen from the very beginning of Revelation as Jesus is portrayed as walking among the lamp stands. Of course, this is no new concept. During his earthly ministry Jesus refers to building 'his church' (Matt. 16:18), and Paul writes that Jesus is head over the church, which is his body. (Ephesians 1:22-23, 5:23; Col. 1:18, 24).This means, as we have seen, that Jesus is intimately involved with his church. He knows his people. He shepherds his people (1 Peter 5). He is present with his people (Matthew 28:20).

- How does this encourage us? How does this truth impact our thoughts about who we are as a church body and what we are called to do?
- When we think of people who are in opposition to us, is our first (or second, or even third) thought, "How can I patiently endure this so as to bring about their salvation?" More often than not, we forget what Paul said in Ephesians 6:10-12. Our battle is not against flesh and blood. It is against great spiritual powers.
- How does the example of Philadelphia and the words of Paul in Ephesians 6 impact the way we see others, especially those who would want to oppose us?

The command in this text is to 'hold fast'. This is a command given to the church community. Unfortunately, we in the West often over emphasize the individual at the expense of the communal.

• Read Hebrews 3:12-19; 4:6-13...These exhortations are, much like in our passage, given to the church for the church so that the church as a whole would persevere. Does this represent our experience in the church? Are we fighting for one another? Are we laboring for each other? What does it look like to make sure that we are all, as a body, holding fast to the name of Christ?
