Sermon Discussion Questions

Ministry with Friends and Early Church Practice
Acts 20:1-16

1. Look on a map where Paul is traveling as he leaves Ephesus. Why did he take such a crazy roundabout route?
2. Paul decides to travel through Macedonia and Greece in Acts 20:1-3, despite facing potential danger and opposition (as mentioned in Acts 19:23-41). Discuss why perseverance is needed.
3. Compare Paul's encouragement to the disciples in Acts 20:1-2 with his exhortation in 1 Thessalonians 5:11. What does it mean to encourage and build others up in the faith? How can you do it?
4. Why do you think Luke decides to list all of Paul's traveling companions? Discuss where they are from, their religious backgrounds, and how the diversity reflects Paul's commitment to a gospel for all people.
5. Read Acts 20:7-11. What does the passage tell us about early Christian worship services?
6. Why is the story of Eutychus in Acts? What's the point?
7. Read the miracle of raising Eutychus from the dead in Acts 20:9-10. Why is the miracle celebrated by communion and more teaching?
8. Consider the practice of breaking bread in Acts 20:7, and explore its connection to the Lord's Supper by examining 1 Corinthians 10:16-17. What is the Lord's Supper?
9. How late at night would you be willing to listen to a good teacher of the Bible? What is the longest period of learning you have ever purposefully and voluntarily sat through?
10. For Christians to meet on Sundays, they would have either met really early and then gone to work or the evening (like Acts 20) after work. Discuss that commitment vs. typical American commitments to gathering with the church.
