

Sermon Discussion Questions Years Later, Same Issues

Acts 21:1-40

- 1. In Acts 20:22-23, Paul is "compelled/constrained" by the Spirit to go to Jerusalem. Is Paul disobeying the Spirit (v.4 and 10-11) by continuing on toward Jerusalem (v.14)?
- 2. In Acts 21:8-9 we get a small detail of Paul's travels. Who is Philip (Read Acts 6:1-7)? In Acts 21:9, we learn that Philip has four unmarried daughters who prophesy. Consider this in the context of Peter's quotation of Joel's prophecy in Acts 2:17-18. What does this tell us about the role of women and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the early church?
- 3. In Acts 21:10-14, Agabus prophesies about Paul's imprisonment in Jerusalem. Reflect on the earlier prophecy of Agabus in Acts 11:27-30. How do these prophecies provide insights into the role of prophetic gifts in the early church?
- 4. What signs were there that James' "Jewish" Christianity and Paul's "Gentile" Christianity were compatible? If so, what is the problem or the point of difficulty?
- 5. The Jerusalem church leaders in Acts 21:15-26 suggest that Paul should partake in a purification ritual to prove his adherence to the Mosaic law. How does this event relate to the theological tension throughout the early chapters of Acts, culminating in the decision in Acts 15?
- 6. Read Acts 21:22-26. What does James recommend as a solution to the tension? How does Paul's action here reflect principles he himself has laid down elsewhere? (cf. Acts 20:24; 1 Cor. 9:20-23; 10:32,33) How might these same principles affect our own attitudes toward others?
- 7. Paul's arrest in Acts 21:27-36 is based on false allegations. This mirrors the situations faced by Stephen in Acts 6:8-15 and Peter in Acts 12:1-5. What can we learn from these instances about the trials faced by the early church leaders?
- 8. Read Acts 21:27-36. What are the parallels between Paul's suffering and Christ's? Why is it important for us personally?
- 9. Read Acts 21:30-39. What does it tell us about Paul that he would turn and speak to the mob when he did?
