

Sermon Discussion

GK Chesterton once wrote: "And though St. John the Evangelist saw many strange monsters in his vision, he saw no creature so wild as one of his own commentators." How connected do you think your eschatology is to how you live your life? (There is more of a connection than you might initially think). Discuss the various ways people read Revelation (Preterist, Historicist, Idealist, Futurist) and how each view impacts how one reads the Bible and lives out the Christian life.

Revelation is meant to be a blessing to those who read it and hear it (Revelation 1:3). How is chapter 6 a blessing?

As we look at what is unfolding in chapter 6, how do these judgments interact with your view of God's sovereignty and justice? How do these events relate to God's sovereignty over creation? Is he in control here or are things out of control?

Looking at the fifth seal (vss. 9-11) How do you believe God will respond to the prayers of these saints and how does that translate to assurance for us and others who are called to suffer for the name of Christ?

The saints in vss. 9-11 are crying out for justice, for God to avenge their blood. We find a similar prayer in Psalm 79:10. In light of the coming of Christ, what does it look like for us to pray for God's justice upon our enemies?

Notice that God tells those praying to wait. What does it look like to wait upon on the Lord? Have someone do a quick search of the word 'wait' in the Psalms and see how often we are encouraged to do so. Why is it so hard to wait?

Further study. Where else in scripture do we see the mention of horses? (Read Zechariah 1:7-17). What similarities or differences do you see between the two passages?
