

Questions about the sermon? Text the phrase SermonQuestions to 94000

- 1.In Acts 22, how does Paul describe his conversion? How does this account compare to the other two accounts of his conversion in Acts (Acts 9:1-19, Acts 26:9-20)? Why do you think these variations exist?
- 2. How is Paul's speech uniquely designed for those he is talking to?
- 3. In Acts 22:7, Paul recounts Jesus asking him, "Why do you persecute me?" How was Paul persecuting Jesus?
- 4. In Acts 22:16, Paul recounts being told to get "baptized and wash your sins away." What does it mean that baptism washes away sin?
- 5. Compare Acts 16:22,23,37-39 and Acts 22:22-29. Who did Paul bring up his citizenship to avoid being flogged in Jerusalem but not in Philippi?
- 6. Paul seems to be leveraging his societal standing for protection from the mob. Are their ways you or others could utilize your standing in our community to further gospel witness?
- 7. Paul's Roman citizenship (Acts 22:25-29) plays a critical role in this chapter. How does your own cultural or national identity impact the way you live out your faith?
- 8. What does Paul's mention of Ananias, a devout observer of the law, tell us about the relationship between Judaism and Christianity in this period? Can you find other characters in Acts who show similar devoutness (Acts 10:1-2)?
- 9. Reflect on Acts 22:10, where Paul asks Jesus, "What shall I do, Lord?" What does this immediate obedience teach us about the response to God's call? How can we apply this willingness to obey in our lives today?
- 10. Why is the crowd angry? Notice that they don't cut Paul off until what he says in verse 21. What is it about Paul's message that is so offensive?
- 11. Paul faces intense opposition for his faith in this passage. In what ways do you face opposition or misunderstanding for your faith in your own context?
