For Further Discussion

Revelation 7:9-10 presents a great multitude from every nation, tribe, people, and language standing before the throne and before the Lamb, thus fulfilling such passages as Genesis 12:3; Isaiah 49:6; and Acts 10.

How does this vision of a diverse, unified worshiping community challenge your understanding of identity and belonging within the church? In what ways can we actively promote and participate in this kind of inclusive community in our church?

Verses 13-17 describe the redeemed as those who have come out of the great tribulation and are now under God's protection, where He will wipe away every tear from their eyes. How do these promises compare with Old Testament prophetic visions of the end times (e.g., Isaiah 25:6-9, Ezekiel 37:24-28)? How does this assurance of ultimate victory and God's tender care influence the way we face current trials and hardships?
