

Sermon Discussion Questions

How Shall We Respond to the Storm? *Acts 27*

- 1. Paul, despite being a prisoner, displays a unique sense of calmness and faith amidst the storm in Acts 27. How does this reflect his teaching in Philippians 4:6-7 about anxiety and peace?
- 2. The voyage has a lot of details. List out all the passages that indicate that Luke experienced these events with Paul (Acts 27:1-12).
- 3. Paul's role aboard the ship (Acts 27) seems to be one of a spiritual leader more than a prisoner. How can we turn what seems like a disaster into a way to care for others?
- 4. Read Acts 27:10. Have you ever experienced a disaster because you wouldn't take the advice of another? How did it go for you? Why did you not listen?
- 5. Read Acts 27:21-26. Despite the men not listening, God graciously intervenes and saves everyone's lives. Discuss ways in which God has eased a disaster of your own doing.
- 6. Read Acts 27:18-26. Paul tells the men to not be afraid but to have courage. Discuss the basis for these encouragements and how hard it was to convince them to do so.
- 7. In verse 22 Paul predicts what will happen. In verse 31 he commands the men to do the thing that will make the prediction come to pass. What is the relationship between what God knows will come to pass and our role in making it come to pass. Why is this a practical issue?
- 8. Luke writes this passage to help us see Paul's lived out convictions in the midst of suffering. What is Luke trying to teach us?
