*Genesis 3:1-7*

- 1.How does understanding the depth of our sin directly impact our understanding of the gospel of Jesus Christ?
- 2.What does it mean to say that we are totally depraved?
- 3.Eve was deceived in part because she did not have a solid hold on the word of God. Read Ephesians 4:11-14. Why must we have a solid grasp on truth?
- 4.We see Eve distort the word of God. How can being involved in Christian community help to guard us from heresy? What danger can there be if we are living in isolation from other believers?
- 5.Read Romans 8:1-4. Discuss together what it means that Christ has freed us from all condemnation. Rejoice together.




### Jordan Mission Trip
