SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

A Murderer's Conversion - Acts 9:1-19

- 1. Talk about various conversions to Christianity that you have seen. What changed in people's lives? What remained the same or changed over a longer period of time?
- 2. When you converted, what were the things you left behind and lost? What were the things you gained? How has the way you have talked about your conversion changed over time?
- 3. Compare Acts 9:1-19 that records Paul's conversion and Acts 22:5-16/Acts 26:1-18 where he retells the story. How is it different? How is it the same? Why did Paul change parts of the story?
- 4. It is often taught that Saul's conversion was dramatic and out of the blue. Check out Acts 22:10 and 26:14. It seems Saul had been stubborn. Discuss how that might change how we view Saul's conversion (and ours).
- 5. What is the significance of Jesus saying, "Saul, why do you persecute me?" How is Saul persecuting Jesus if he has never met him?
- 6. How can we share our testimony in a way that brings glory to ourselves? Bring glory to God? How might you change or emphasize your testimony based on who you are talking to?
- 7. Saul's conversion is an illustration of John 6:44 and 15:16. Discuss.
- 8. In verse 18, Saul gets baptized. Why do you think all the conversion stories keep noting that the people got baptized? Why was it a big deal that Ananias chose to baptize him?
- 9. Is there anyone in your life who you act like is too far from God's grace to be saved? Are there people you have given up on? Take time to talk about these people and pray together for them.
