# Sermon Discussion Questions

We Could Touch Him

*1 John 1:1-4*

1. What does “incarnation” mean, and how is it depicted in Scripture? (John 1:14; Philippians 2:5-8)
2. What does it mean that Jesus was “the Word”? Explore the theme of the “Word” in John 1:1-14 and Revelation 19:13. What attributes of Jesus are highlighted through the title “Word”? See Psalm 107:20.
3. Why did the Word become flesh? What purposes of God are achieved through the Incarnation? (Hebrews 2:14-18; 1 John 3:8; Luke 19:10)
4. How is the Incarnation central to our salvation? Why was it necessary for Jesus to be both God and man in the process of our redemption? (Romans 8:3; Hebrews 9:22, 2 Corinthians 5:21)
5. John begins by pointing out that they have heard, seen, and touched Jesus. What is the significance of John emphasizing these sensory experiences in the context of the early Christian church and emerging heresies of the time?
6. Throughout the Old Testament, the phrase “the word of the Lord” often appears, especially in relation to the prophets (e.g., Jeremiah 1:4). In what ways might the incarnation of Jesus, the Word made flesh, serve as a culmination of the word given to and through the prophets?
7. How do truth and joy interplay in John’s writings? (Reflect on John 15:11 and John 17:13)
8. John writes to make his joy complete. How does sharing the message of Christ complete one’s joy?
9. At the heart of this passage is the incarnation, God coming to us in human flesh. How does the reality of the incarnation challenge or change the way you view God’s love for humanity?
10. How should the doctrine of the Incarnation influence our daily walk, our view of humanity, and our service for the kingdom? (1 John 4:2-3; Philippians 2:5-11)
