Sermon Discussion Questions

By Grace Through Faith
Ephesians 2:1-10

1. What do you think it means to be dead in transgressions and sins? What are the three different masters that are served (v2-3)?
2. In what ways was your life like that?
3. According to vs 3, we all deserve wrath because of sin. Why do so many of us (and others) seem to make excuses for the wrath sin deserves (e.g., the God of the New Testament isn't a God of wrath)?
4. Given what we deserve, how great is the love of God toward us?
5. Vs 5 is a passive verb (as in the subject is not doing the action), why is it important that it is God that makes us alive, and not the other way around?
6. What do you think it means to be seated with Christ in the heavenly realms? How does the fact that, even now, we are mysteriously present with Christ strengthen our faith and walk with the Lord?
7. What are the ways we tend to struggle with God's grace in saving us?
 - a. Do you try to prove yourself right before God through your good actions?
 - b. Do you think your good actions will actually save you apart from Christ?
 - c. Why do you think many people who don't know Christ bank on "I'm a pretty good person?" What about the gospel are they missing?
8. The main point of this passage is not vs 8-9 (although they are great verses), but rather vs 10. Why do works follow AFTER grace and not before? How might this compare with James 2:14-26 (particularly 26)? Why might we struggle with putting the works before the faith?
9. Vs 10 calls us God's workmanship, what does it mean to be anothers' workmanship? How might this free you to do good works instead of being forced to do good works?
10. Take some time to pray thanking God that he saved us – not because of our own goodness, but his, and that he has given us good works to do to glorify his name.
