Sermon Discussion

- When you talk about God's blessing, what usually comes to mind? When you say, "I am so blessed," what are you most often referring to?
- Why does the psalmist ask for God's blessing? How is this different from how we often think about God blessing us? In what ways do we tend to treat blessings as an end in themselves instead of as a means for God's mission?
- How does Psalm 67 show that the ultimate goal is not just people being helped, but people praising God with joy? What do you think it means for us to live in such a way that others might "be glad and sing for joy" because of God?
- God aims to be enjoyed and feared (v4, 7) by all people, including you. "The goal of missions is the gladness of the peoples in the greatness of God."
- The psalm ends with the earth yields its harvest, and "all the ends of the earth will fear him." How does this connect to Jesus' command in Matthew 28:18-20 and the vision of Revelation 7:9-10?
- Spend time praying that God would bless your group, not simply for your own good, but so that His "saving power" might be known among the nations.
- For Further Study: Connect Psalm 67 with Numbers 6:24-26 and Gen 12:1-3. How does Psalm 67 reinterpret this blessing, moving from personal/communal well-being to a global missionary purpose (v. 2)? How does Psalm 67 envision Gen 12 fulfilled?
