

Sermon Discussion Questions

I Love the Church Ephesians 4:1-16

- 1. What is a church?
- 2. Discuss the sentiment, "I love Jesus, but not the church." How do you think American consumerism and our highly individualistic culture shapes our view of church?
- 3. It seems to live "a life worthy of your calling" is a life lived with others in unity. When you think of living a worthy life, does your mind go to accomplishing things or living in community with others in a peaceful way?
- 4. Reflect on the seven "ones" mentioned in verses 4-6. Why might Paul be emphasizing this repetition? What's the significance of this for the church?
- 5. Verse 7-11 speaks of gifts given to all believers. How does Paul's assertion that Christ gives gifts to every believer democratize the idea of ministry?
- 6. Consider the roles listed by Paul (apostles, prophets, evangelists, shepherds, teachers). How do each of these roles, in their unique ways, serve the church?
- 7. In verse 12-13 we are told of some gifts within the church. The gifts are given "to equip the saints for the work of ministry." In what ways might we be overlooking or undervaluing the gifts we've been given?
- 8. Verses 14-15 assume the spiritual infancy of everyone. What does it mean to be a spiritual infant?
- 9. When you think about how to move away from spiritual infancy, do you think of things you need to do by yourself or stuff you need to do with other people? Notice verse 15-16. What are ways to leave infancy behind?
- 10. The imagery in verse 16 describes the church as a body, intricately connected and dependent on every part. How does this challenge the way you view your role in the church? How might this passage call you to serve or connect more deeply?
