- 24-hour news, total connectivity, a constant barrage of bad news. What drives your anxiety about the world? How much information can you handle before it overwhelms you?
- Psalm 46 begins, “God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.” What kinds of troubles do you think the psalmist has in mind (vv. 1–3)? How does the imagery of earthquakes, mountains falling, and roaring seas capture the chaos we sometimes feel in life?
- In what ways do people often seek “refuges” outside of God (comfort, success, approval, control)? Why do these ultimately fail in times of trouble?
- Verse 10 is often quoted: “Be still, and know that I am God.” In context, this is not only about personal quiet time but about recognizing God’s supremacy over the nations. How does this change the way you read it?
- God’s glory is not hanging in the balance of our circumstances. He will be exalted, whether through judgment or salvation, by humbling nations or by raising up His church. The question is not whether God will be exalted—the question is whether you will live in light of that reality. How then shall you live? Give specific examples.
