- Name one honest emotion you've felt in response to this week's violence (Charlotte, Colorado, Utah). Where do you feel it in your body? Read Matt 5:43–48 aloud slowly. What word or phrase lands on you and why?
- Where have you quietly redrawn the word “neighbor” to keep certain people out — and what are you protecting in your heart by doing so (comfort, control, tribe, reputation)? In what ways have you loved only “your own” (vv.46–47)? Name one outsider you will greet, host, or help — by name.
- Name one real person/group you resist loving. What is one inconvenient good (pray by name, truthful kindness, unseen generosity) you can do for them this week — and what resistance rises in you as you imagine doing it?
- What contrasts does Jesus make (love/hate, neighbor/enemy, tax collectors/Gentiles, sons of the Father)? List them.
- If fear, outrage, or political identity functioned as your “savior” this week, how did that shape your response to those you see as enemies? How does the cross — God loving his enemies — reorder those loves?
- Imagine our church actually practiced vv.44–45 for 30 days. What concrete habits (speech online, hospitality to ideological outsiders, peacemaking, intercession) would mark us? What would it cost our church to be known for enemy-love in our city, and where will that cost press on your idols (comfort, being right, control)?
