For Further Discussion

The Hallelujah of Justice (vv. 1-4): In these verses, the heavenly multitude praises God for His righteous judgment on Babylon. How does this passage challenge or affirm our understanding of God's justice? Why do you think it's important for worship to include celebrating God's justice, and how should that shape the way we respond to injustice in our world?

The Joy of the Wedding Feast (vv. 5-7): The marriage of the Lamb is a central theme in this passage. What does the imagery of a wedding tell us about the nature of our relationship with God? In what ways does seeing ourselves as "the bride" deepen our understanding of the gospel and shape our daily Christian walk?

Clothed in Righteous Deeds (v. 8): The text describes the bride as being given "fine linen, bright and clean," representing "the righteous deeds of the saints." How do we reconcile this with salvation by grace alone? What does this suggest about the role of obedience and good works in the Christian life, and how can we cultivate a deeper desire to serve God out of joy rather than obligation?
