- Before the sermon, how familiar were you with the passage? Did you change your mind about anything?
- How were you personally challenged or encouraged?
- How might we apply the passage and teaching to our own lives?

For Further Discussion

1. *End-times beliefs impact how you read the Biblical story. Talk about what views of the end you have been taught and how they impact your reading of Scripture and current events. Have your views changed over time? How so?*
2. *I think it would be helpful if you walked through the major end-times beliefs and talk through where they originate in Scripture. Here is a guide:*
 - a. *Pre-Tribulational Premillennialism*
 - b. *Post-Tribulational Premillennialism*
 - c. *Postmillennialism*
 - d. *Amillennialism*
3. *Christ comes as a warrior. Read the overwhelming description of him in 19:11-16. What do you think of this picture of Jesus – especially one whose sword strikes people down, whose scepter rules, and who treads the winepress of the fury of the wrath of God? How often should we emphasize this picture of him to others and each other? Why is this picture encouraging?*
4. *Look at 19:19-20 and 20:9-10. Notice how in the end there is no actual battle – Satan just loses. How does the certainty of Satan's final defeat give you confidence as you face the brokenness of this world? How should this influence how you engage with people who do not yet believe in the gospel, knowing the end of the story?*
