TALKING ABOUT JESUS WITH PEOPLE FROM DIFFERENT
RELIGIOUS BACKGROUNDS - ACTS 14:1-20

1. Pull out a map (typically in the back of Bibles) and trace the journey of Paul and Barnabas.
2. Verse 1 - Notice that Paul is now listed first ahead of Barnabas. Why does Luke do this? Do you think Barnabas cared? Think of a person who has deferred to someone who is more gifted. How did they do it?
3. Look at the two responses in v1-2 to Paul and Barnabas' preaching. Why do you think the opposition was strong enough that they ended up recruiting others to their cause?
4. Look at the response to miracles in Iconium in v4 vs Lystra in v8ff. What does each response tell us about the people?
5. Lystra is the first location where Paul preaches to people that are not familiar with the Bible. The summary of his message is found in v15-18. How is it different from how he speaks to the Jews and Gentiles who know the Bible? Compare Acts 13:16-41 vs 14:15-18.
6. How might Paul encourage you to share the gospel with someone who does not have a nominally Christian religious upbringing?
7. One day the crowd is acting like Paul is a God and the next day they stone him. How does Paul respond to both?
8. Paul gets stoned after his first attempt to share the gospel with people who have never read a Bible or heard a Bible read. Why did he persist? How can we?
