Sermon Discussion

- Before the sermon, how familiar were you with the passage? Did you change your mind about anything?
- How were you personally challenged or encouraged?
- How might we apply the passage and teaching to our own lives?

For Further Discussion

Discuss: No matter what you think about what happened from 2016 to 2024 in America, the evidence suggests churches have failed to disciple people in the realm of political engagement. Many are leaving churches over politics before they will leave their politics for a church.

Discuss: Those who avoid all political discussions and engagement are essentially casting a vote for the social status quo. American churches in the early 19th century that did not speak out against slavery because that was what we would now call "getting political" were actually supporting slavery by doing so. To not be political is to be political.

How do we ensure that our political loyalties do not overshadow our ultimate loyalty to Jesus Christ as Lord?

In what ways can political engagement become an idol, and how can we guard against that in our lives and church community?

How does the church's witness suffer when Christians are perceived as aligning too closely with one political party or leader?

How should we respond when political leaders promote policies that contradict Christian teachings?

How do we faithfully represent Jesus in the public square, being known more for our love for Christ and our neighbor than for our political affiliations?
