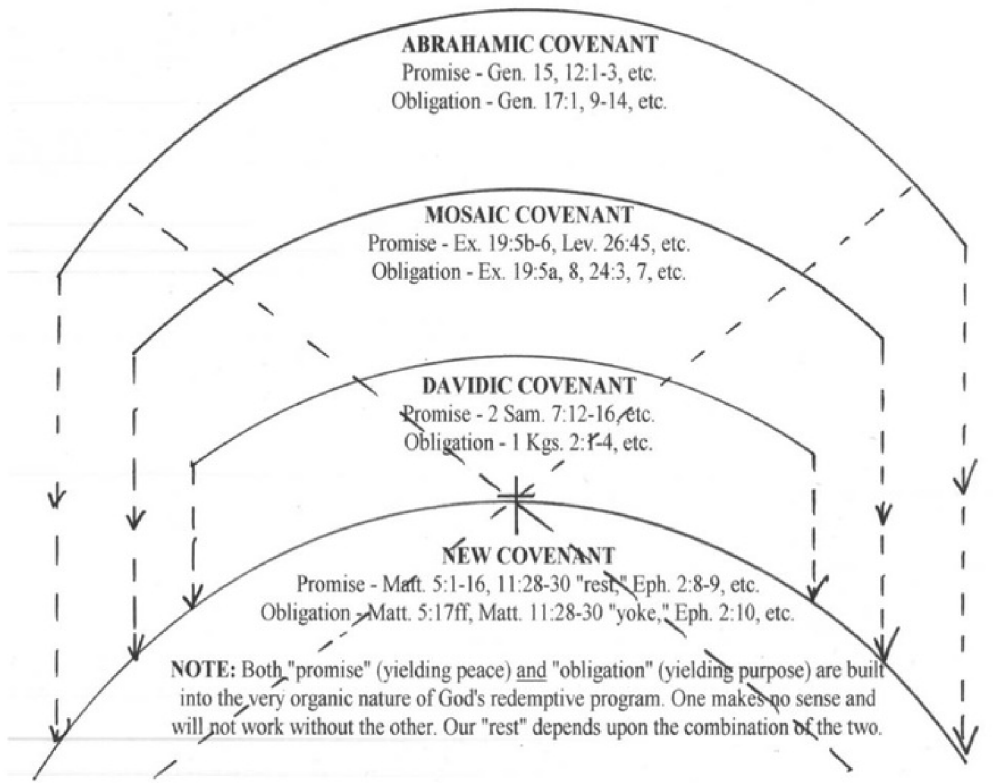

Sermon Discussion Questions

The God Who Became Flesh
John 1:1-18

1. Review the story of Scripture as we have covered so far, how is the coming of Jesus the climax of the storyline? How do we see God's promises fulfilled in Christ?
2. John writes that Jesus came to make God known. This is reiterated in the NT in places like Hebrews 1:1-3 and Colossians 1:15-20. As we consider the life of Christ, what do we learn about God?
3. How does considering the pre-incarnate state of Jesus emphasize the grace and mercy of the incarnation? Think about this gives greater light to what we read in Philippians 2:5-8.
4. The incarnation teaches that Jesus is fully God and fully man. Why is this a necessary truth? What does it mean for our salvation that Jesus is fully God? (consider Matthew 9:1-8) What does it mean for our salvation that Jesus is fully man? (Consider Hebrews 2:14-18)
