Putting Down Roots - Acts 14:21-28

- 1. How long did it take you to understand what you signed up for when you became a Christian? Have your expectations of what it means to follow Christ changed over the years? How?
- 2. Why did Paul return to the cities he had been instead of just pressing into new territory to share the gospel with more people?
- 3. List all the ways Paul and Barnabas followed up with the people who had come to faith in Christ?
- 4. As you think through the beginning stages of your Christian life, were you "followed up" with in a helpful way that equipped you for the Christian life?
- 5. As you think about those who you talk to in the beginning stages of the Christian life, do you follow up with them to help them get beyond their initial conversion? How can you do a better job?
- 6. What specific ways did Paul help them remain "true to the faith?" How have people helped you stay true?
- 7. Paul's message to the young converts is "we must go through many trials to enter the Kingdom of God" (v22). What does that mean?
- 8. Why did Paul and Barnabas appoint elders? What did they expect the elders to do? See Acts 20:28-32 and 2 Tim 1:12-14)
- 9. When Paul and Barnabas get back home, they report back to the church. Why is that important?
- 10. When you have heard missionary reports from people who went out and came back, how has that impacted and challenged your faith?
