SERMON DISCUSSION

- 1. Habakkuk starts with a question (Hab 1:2–4). Why is he confused? Where do you most feel like Habakkuk right now seeing injustice and wondering why God is silent? What would it look like to bring that complaint to God honestly without sliding into cynicism this week?
- 2. **God's unsettling answer** (Hab 1:5–11). Has God ever used something you wouldn't have chosen to accomplish something you deeply needed? How might trusting his wisdom not just his power reframe one current frustration?
- 3. Waiting by faith, not by sight (Hab 2:1–4). "The righteous shall live by his faith." What concrete practice could help you "station yourself on the rampart" (v.1) this week e.g., a daily watch-and-record time to trade worry for watchfulness?
- 4. **Resisting the idols that ruin us** (Hab 2:18–20). Which modern idol (success, security, approval, control, nation, pleasure) most tempts you to say, "Awake! Arise!"? What specific step will you take to dethrone it an act of generosity, confession, boundary, or Sabbath?
- 5. From trembling to trusting (Hab 3:16–19). What would "yet I will rejoice" look like in your current lack (vv.17–18)? Name one area to practice joy-before-deliverance and one way your group can support you (song, prayer, check-in, or tangible help).
