- Before the sermon, how familiar were you with the passage? Did you change your mind about anything?
- How were you personally challenged or encouraged?
- How might we apply the passage and teaching to our own lives?

For Further Discussion

Ok. Have it out. Where do you stand? Is Revelation 20:1-6 describing the present time or is it something that happens in the future? Dig deeper:

- 1. If Rev 20:1-6 is happening in the future, how would you explain when Isaiah 65:17-25 happens? (E.g. Justice and peace reign, but people still die.)
- 2. Those who argue Rev 20:1-6 is currently happening, say Satan is presently bound, chained, and sealed. Do you think that a good description of what is happening presently?
- 3. For those who argue Rev 20:1-6 is happening in the future: At the end of chapter 19, everyone against Christ is wiped out. Who then are the people fighting against Jesus in chapter 20?
- 4. Those who believe Rev 20:1-6 happens in the future, must necessarily believe that physical death somehow continues to exist beyond Christ's second coming. Those dying must be either the unbelieving children born to those believers who entered the millennial age in physical, unglorified bodies OR the believing children born to those believers will be subject to physical death. How do you make sense of this and the end of chapter 19?
- 5. Now that you have had it out....what matters? Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18. How might you obey the command of verse 18?
- 6. And now for judgment. Revelation 20:11-15 is the final judgment. What does it mean that people were "judged according to what they had done"? How does this concept align with salvation by faith?
- 7. Last one. What is the significance of "death and Hades" being thrown into the lake of fire? What does this indicate about the finality of Christ's victory over sin and death? How can we find comfort in this assurance of victory in our present struggles with sin or fear of death?
