SERMON DISCUSSION

- 1. God's people had become complacent (Zeph. 1:12).
 - a. Where have you become spiritually passive?
 - b. What regular practice could put you back on the front foot?
- 2. Sin reverses creation's order and drains life from the world (Gen 1:20-28, Hosea 4:1-3, Zeph. 1:2-3). Where do you see that reversal - relationships, work, community?
- 3. Zephaniah 2:3 says to "seek humility" a through-line of meekness that is found throughout the Bible. Identify a conflict that might look different if a "Jesus-shaped" posture of humility were taken. Are there any in your life?
- 4. God rejoices over His people with singing (Zeph. 3:14-17). Do your failures feel more real than God's delight? What changes knowing that God "rejoices over you with singing" (anxieties, relationships, etc)? Are there things in your life that need to be brought under that song?
- 5. God's plan stretches to the ends of the earth (Zeph. 3:9-10). Are there far off or "unlikely" people our church effectively ignores? How might we move toward them?
