Sermon Notes

SERMON DISCUSSION

1. Haggai 1:4, 6, 9–11: God is showing His people that their priorities are upside down. Are there any areas where you sense God might be frustrating your efforts to reorder your priorities? How might God be using areas of frustration to invite you to “consider your ways” (1:5-7) before Him by pointing out life’s futility?
2. Haggai 2:3–9: Some of the older people cried because the new temple looked so unimpressive. Yet, God doesn’t promise a flashier building but His presence and future glory. Where do you feel like what you’re doing for God is “so small” or “doesn’t really matter”?
3. Haggai 2:4–5 & 2 Thessalonians 1:11–12: God tells them to work, and Paul prays that God would give power to their “work of faith.” What does it look like for you to “work” for the Lord? What’s the difference between waiting on God versus being passive and working hard versus self-reliance?
4. Haggai 2:11–14: Uncleanness spreads more easily than holiness; yet holy things don’t automatically make you holy. How are your screen habits, conversations, music, and friendships “rubbing off” on you spiritually? Is there something that is slowly pulling you away from God?
