For Further Discussion

Read 22:6. Are there specific promises you struggle to fully believe or rely on in your life?

The book ends with reminders that a significant part of its message deals with pseudo-believers in the visible covenant community. What might that pseudo-belief look like in our social context?

One application is that faithful endurance and obedience results in glorifying God. How often is this the measuring stick of our faith and church life?

Verses 7, 12: Jesus says, "I am coming soon." How should this affect the way we live our daily lives? What adjustments might you need to make to live with a greater sense of readiness for His return?

Verses 18-19: What are the dangers of adding to or taking away from God's Word in our modern context? Are there areas where you feel pressure to alter or avoid biblical truths? How can you remain faithful in a culture that challenges the authority of Scripture?

Verse 20: John responds, "Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!" How does this simple prayer reveal the heart attitude of a believer? What would it look like for you to cultivate a deeper longing for Christ's return in your own life?
