

## Benediction

Questions about the sermon? Text the phrase SermonQuestions to 94000 1. When was the church born? What is the church? What is the difference (if any) between a group of Christians getting together and the church gathered?

- a. Consider what we read in 1 Corinthians 5:3-5. In what ways does Paul distinguish this gathering and how does that inform our understanding of the church?
- 2. Paul speaks of Christ breaking down the "wall of hostility" (v.14) and through that unifying the church. What are the modern 'walls' or barriers within our local church that need to be addressed? How can we work to bring about the unity Christ has accomplished?
  - a. Consider how often Paul speaks of unity in Ephesians: Eph. 4:1-7, 11-16, 25, 32.
- 3. Paul emphasizes that Gentiles are no longer foreigners (v.12) but fellow citizens and members of the household of God (v.19). How does 1 Peter 2:4-6 enhance our understanding of this image? What does it mean for us to be citizens of God's kingdom in our local church context?
- 4. Paul writes that the church is built on the teachings of the apostles and prophets, in what ways can we strengthen our commitment to biblical teaching?
  - a. Consider what we read in Ephesians 4-6.
- 5. How do we practically obey the commands to submit to our leaders (Hebrews 13:7; 1 Peter 5:1-5), submit to one another (Ephesians 5:15-21), and be a community that actively seeks to maintain the integrity of the congregation (Matthew 18:15-20)?
