THE GOSPEL TRIUMPHS REGARDLESS
ACTS 15:36-16:10

As you meditate on this passage together and go from understanding the passage to prayer, ask yourself these questions:

- What does it teach you
 - What does it teach you to be thankful for (thanksgiving)
 - What does it teach you to confess (confession)
 - What does it teach you to ask for (prayer)
1. Have you ever had a sharp disagreement with another Christian you were close to that caused you to part ways? Talk with others about what happened.
 2. Paul and Barnabas split after years of being together. From what we know of their personalities, why do you think this happened?
 3. Barnabas leaves with John Mark to Cyprus. Go read 1 Cor 9:6; Col 4:10; Philemon 24; 2 Tim 4:11. What do these passages tell us about what happened after the split?
 4. Silas leaves with Paul. Look up places in the NT where he appears. How did he help Paul (lots in Acts plus 2 Cor 1:19; 1 Thess 1:1; 2 Thess 1:1) and Peter (1 Pet 5:12)?
 5. How did God work the split of two friends for good? Has he ever done that for you?
 6. In Acts 16:1-5 Paul circumcises Timothy. In Gal 2:3-5 he refused to circumcise Titus. The Acts 15 council concluded that people did not have to be circumcised. Paul tells Gentiles not to be circumcised (1 Cor 7:18-20). So why did Paul circumcise Timothy?
 7. The result of Paul and Timothy's work was that "the churches were strengthened". What do you think that means.
 8. Paul and his team is kept by the Holy Spirit from preaching in an area? Has God ever stopped you through various circumstances from doing something good that you wanted to do? How did you know it was God?

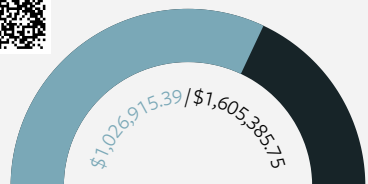
2030 Vision
