





Is God In The Way?

Psalm 2

1. Almost every culture has a story or myth about a good king during some golden age. Why do you think humans long for a king that is good and just?
 2. The world is very religious and yet Psalm 2 says the nations rage against God. How have you seen this in nations? In individuals? In you?
 3. The word for "plot" in verse 1 is the same word translated as "meditate" in Psalm 1. Compare the responses to God in Psalm 1 and 2.
 4. God and his Messiah have put a yoke on people they do not want. What does it look like to throw off God's claim of ownership on your life? Check out Romans 8:7 which explains our natural disposition.
 5. We are all "yoked" to some kind of master that demands things from us. Have Christ's commands ever felt bad for you but given you freedom? Are there things you have followed on your own that have felt like freedom but turned out to enslave you? Be specific.
 6. Verse 4, Ps 37:13, and Ps 59:8 are the only recorded times in Scripture when God laughs. Why is he laughing?
 7. Verse 11 calls for submission to the King. Take some time this week to go through your life and ask whether He is a King who can command you or a consultant that gives you advice.
 8. How do the New Testament writers interpret this Psalm? Check out Ps 2:1-2/Acts 4:25-26, Ps 2:7/Acts 13:33, Ps 2:8-9/Rev 2:26-27.
 9. In verse 12, we are to "Kiss the son". A kiss is both submission and affection. How do these two play out in a relationship with Jesus?
 10. In verse 12, we are called to "take refuge" in the Son. Who are we taking refuge from?
- For personal study:
1. What does it teach you
 2. What does it teach you to be thankful for (thanksgiving)
 3. What does it teach you to confess (confession)
 4. What does it teach you to ask for (prayer)


2030 Vision
