

Sermon Discussion Questions

The End is Just the Beginning Revelation 21-22

- 1. What do you imagine the New Creation to be like? Read 21:1-5. What is the new heaven and earth like? In what ways does this vision provide hope?
- 2. The New Creation is God dwelling with his people (Revelation 21:3). Let's deep dive this:
 - a. How does this ultimately fulfill Exodus 25:8 and Ezekiel 37:27?
 - b. Why is there no temple in the New Creation (John 2:19-21; 1 Corinthians 3:16, Ephesians 2:21)?
- 3. Reflect on the access to the Tree of Life (22:14) vs the restricted access to the OT temple and discuss what that means for our relationship with God.
- 4. Read Revelation 21:6-8/22:14-15. When you read passages of promise and warning, what is your reaction? Why are there warnings in Scripture? How do the warnings of Scripture inform our evangelism?
- 5. Revelation is written to a heavily persecuted group of Christians. Why are warnings and the promises helpful for their perseverance? How are these promises and warning helpful for your perseverance?
 - a. Consider other places where we see pastoral warnings given to persecuted believers. Hebrews 5:11-6:12, 10:19-39
- 6. Revelation ends with an altar call (Revelation 22:17). How can you extend the invitation in Revelation to others this year? Who do you have in mind. Pray for them, write it down, and check back with each other in next month.
