

# Men's and Women's Bible Studies Beginning the week of January 19

Registration Is Open - Multiple Days and Times Available

#### SERMON DISCUSSION

- 1. In Joel 1–2, God uses the locust plague as an "alarm clock" for his people (Joel 1:2–4; 2:1). How might Hebrews 12:5–11 and Luke 13:1–5 help you see painful or disappointing circumstances this Advent not as random, but as God's loving invitation to return to him?
- 2. Joel 2:12–13 calls us to "rend your hearts" rather than just tear garments. In this busy Advent season, where do you see a gap between your outward spiritual activity and your inward heart, and how could James 4:8–10 and 2 Corinthians 7:9–10 lead you into deeper repentance?
- 3. Joel promises that God will pour out his Spirit on "all flesh" (Joel 2:28–29), fulfilled at Pentecost (Acts 2:16–21). If that same Spirit now lives in you (Romans 8:9–11; Galatians 4:4–7), how should that shape the way you enter Advent your expectations, your prayers, your relationships? What is one concrete area this Advent where you need to stop living as if you're on your own and rely on his power?
- 4. Joel describes the Day of the Lord as both judgment and rescue: "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Joel 2:31–32; Romans 10:9–13). How does knowing Jesus has already faced the ultimate Day of the Lord for you (2 Corinthians 5:21) change the way you think and live as you anticipate the final Day?
- 5. Joel ends with God as both roaring judge and safe refuge (Joel 3:16–21), pointing to Christ's first and second comings. In one specific situation this week, how could Advent hope a Savior who has come and will come again reshape your response in light of Romans 12:17–21 and James 5:7–8?
