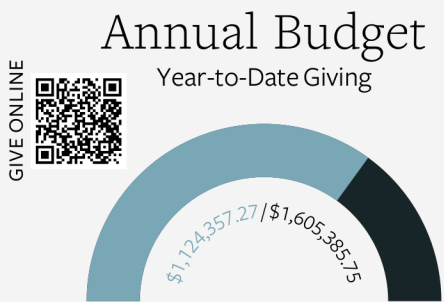

I Can Die In Peace
Luke 2:22-40

1. Share as a group some of the things you are waiting on the Lord for. Have you been frustrated or happy to wait?
2. Luke seems to emphasize Simeon and Anna as very old and Joseph and Mary as very young? Why?
3. Read Leviticus 12 and Exodus 13:2. What three things did the purification require, and why did Joseph and Mary obey them?
4. Simeon and Anna are presented as examples of people waiting a long time for the Messiah. What were they doing while they waited? How can we follow their example?
5. Verse 27 - Simeon is "moved by the Spirit" to go to the temple. What does it mean to be prompted by God to do something? Have you ever experienced this?
6. Read verses 34-35. What do you think Mary thought about the words Simeon said to her?
 - a. How did Mary suffer as the mother of Jesus?
 - b. How were/are the hearts of people revealed/exposed by the coming of Jesus?
7. Why mention a widow as one of the people who found Jesus first? How were widows typically treated (Exodus 22:21-22; Deuteronomy 10:17-18; 14:29; 1 Timothy 5:3-16)?
8. Jesus is called the *consolation of Israel* (v25) and the *redemption of Jerusalem* (v38). How did Jesus fulfill these statements?
9. Share ways in which you can encourage each other to wait on the Lord.
